CALIFORNIA CONSUMER PRIVACY STATEMENT

Last Updated: January 1, 2023

This California Consumer Privacy Statement supplements the Website Privacy Policy and applies solely to California consumers, including but not limited to, representatives of our institutional investors, vendors and business partners, and individuals who act as our contractors, advisors and consultants.

This Statement does not apply to (i) TPG employees, owners, officers, directors, (ii) job applicants seeking opportunities at TPG, or (iii) information collected, processed, sold or disclosed pursuant to the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act (and its implementing regulations) or the California Financial Information Privacy Act.

This California Consumer Privacy Statement (the "Statement") uses certain terms that have the meaning given to them in the California Consumer Privacy Act of 2018 (as amended by the California Privacy Rights Act of 2020) and its implementing regulations (collectively, the "CCPA/CPRA").

1. Notice of Collection and Use of Personal Information

We may collect (and may have collected during the 12-month period prior to the effective date of this Statement) the following categories of personal information about you online or offline:

- Identifiers: identifiers such as a real name, alias, postal address, unique personal identifier (such as a device identifier; cookies, beacons, pixel tags; unique pseudonym or user alias; telephone number), online identifier, internet protocol address, email address, account name, Social Security number, driver's license number, passport number, and other similar identifiers
- Additional Data Subject to Cal. Civ. Code § 1798.80: signature, physical characteristics or description, state identification card number, education, bank account number, credit card number, debit card number and other financial information, and medical information
- **Protected Classifications:** characteristics of protected classifications under California or federal law, such as race, color, national origin, age, sex, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, marital status, medical condition, disability, citizenship status, and military and veteran status
- Commercial Information: commercial or investment information, including records of personal property, financial products or investment services purchased, obtained, or considered, and other investing or consuming histories or tendencies
- Online Activity: Internet and other electronic network activity information, including, but not limited to, browsing history, search history, and information regarding your interaction with websites, applications or advertisements
- Sensory Information: audio, electronic, visual, and similar information
- **Employment Information:** professional or employment-related information, such as information relating to your job position (<u>e.g.</u>, job title, job description and office location) and, if you are an advisor or consultant to TPG, additional information such as compensation and payroll details (<u>e.g.</u>, bank account details, information relating to personal investments, and tax-related information),

talent management information (e.g., resumé information, education details, certifications and professional associations, historical compensation details, previous employment details, and information received in connection with background checks and references), corporate travel information, and information about your use of TPG's IT resources (e.g., the time and duration of internet and network connections, how you use technology resources, electronic communications you send/receive and the contents thereof, software and files you download and access, and voicemails you receive).

• Inferences: inferences drawn from any of the information identified above to create a profile about you reflecting your preferences, characteristics, psychological trends, predispositions, behavior, attitudes, intelligence, abilities, and aptitudes.

We may use (and may have used during the 12-month period prior to the effective date of this Statement) your personal information for the purposes described in the TPG Website Privacy Policy and for the following business purposes specified in the CCPA/CPRA:

- Performing services, including maintaining or servicing accounts, providing customer service, processing or fulfilling orders and transactions, verifying customer information, processing payments, providing financing, providing analytics services, providing storage, or providing similar services
- Providing advertising and marketing services to you, except for cross-context behavioral advertising (which is addressed in section 6 of this Statement)
- Auditing related to counting ad impressions to unique visitors, verifying positioning and quality of ad impressions, and auditing compliance with this specification and other standards
- Short-term, transient use, including but not limited to nonpersonalized advertising shown as part of your current interaction with us
- Helping to ensure security and integrity to the extent the use of your personal information is reasonably necessary and proportionate for these purposes
- Debugging to identify and repair errors that impair existing intended functionality
- Undertaking internal research for technological development and demonstration
- Undertaking activities to verify or maintain the quality or safety of a service or device that is owned, manufactured, manufactured for, or controlled by us, and to improve, upgrade, or enhance the service or device that is owned, manufactured, manufactured for, or controlled by us

In addition, if you are a contractor, advisor or consultant to TPG, we may use your personal information for purposes of carrying out and supporting HR functions and activities, including managing work activities and personnel, conducting business operations, performing strategic planning, operating our facilities, ensuring business continuity, accommodating disabilities or illnesses, protecting the health and safety of our staff and others, and safeguarding, monitoring, and maintaining our office equipment, facilities, and other property. We may also use your personal information in connection with our marketing efforts.

2. Retention of Personal Information

We will retain your personal information for the time period reasonably necessary to achieve the purposes described in our Website Privacy Policy and this Statement, or any other notice provided at the time of collection, taking into account applicable statutes of limitation and records retention requirements under applicable law.

3. Sources of Personal Information

We may obtain (and may have obtained during the 12-month period prior to the effective date of this Statement), personal information about you from the following sources:

- From you, for example, through your use of our websites or mobile applications, when you send us an email, visit our facilities, or otherwise contact or communicate with us
- From monitoring tools, such as cookies that track your use of our websites or mobile applications and security cameras in certain of our facilities
- Our affiliates and subsidiaries
- Our portfolio companies
- Our institutional investors
- From your employer, if you are an adviser or consultant
- Businesses that we are evaluating in connection with a potential investment or business opportunity
- Prospective lenders to or creditors of a fund or portfolio company in which we have or are considering investing
- Vendors who provide services on our behalf
- Broker-dealers, advisors and other business partners
- Background check providers
- Recruiting agencies, social media networks or publicly available sources

4. Disclosure of Personal Information

During the 12-month period prior to the effective date of this Statement, we may have disclosed the following categories of personal information about you for a business purpose to the following categories of third parties:

5. Sale or Sharing of Personal Information

We do not sell personal information or share personal information for cross-context behavioral advertising purposes.

6. California Consumer Privacy Rights

You have certain choices regarding our use and disclosure of your personal information, as described below.

Access: You have the right to request, twice in a 12-month period, that we disclose to you the personal information we have collected, used, and disclosed about you during the past 12 months.

Correction: You have the right to request that we correct the personal information we maintain about you, if that information is inaccurate.

Deletion: You have the right to request that we delete certain personal information we have collected from you.

Verifying Requests: To help protect your privacy and maintain security, we will take steps to verify your identity before granting you access to your personal information or complying with your request. If you request access to or correction or deletion of your personal information, we may require you to provide any of the following information: address, date of birth, unique personal identifier, nationality, telephone number, email address, CV information or details of a transaction. In addition, if you ask us to provide you with specific pieces of personal information, we will require you to sign a declaration under penalty of perjury that you are the consumer whose personal information is the subject of the request.

Additional Information: If you choose to exercise any of your rights under the CCPA/CPRA, you have the right to not receive discriminatory treatment by us. To the extent permitted by applicable law, we may charge a reasonable fee to comply with your request.
